A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Mahadevananda Mahavidyalaya, a co-educational day College, affiliated previously to the University of Calcutta (date of affiliation: 29-07-1968), was founded in Bengal, by Late Swami Jyotirmoyananda Giri Maharaj, in the sacred memory of his preceptor Late Swami Mahadevananda Giri Maharaj, on the auspicious day of Janmashtami, and Independence Day, the 15th of August, 1968. 15th of August being a holiday, the 16th of August had been officially declared as the Foundation Day of the College.



The College, a multi faculty one, now under West Bengal State University (year of affiliation 2008) is situated within the KMDA area, on the eastern bank of the river Hooghly. It is well-connected by road, river-traffic and the railway station which is only 2 kms from the campus.

In the late sixties, when the College was founded, Monirampore, though well-known for the quality products of its many brick-fields, was a sparsely populated, quiet, semi-urban area. Today Monirampore is semi-urban, semi-industrial and densely populated.

Mahadevananda Mahavidyalaya is also the only college in the area with a study centre providing various popular courses of Netaji Subhas Open University catering to variety of needs of higher education not only of the local people but also of the people belonging to the wide catchment area of the college. The College was included in the list of colleges by UGC U/S 2F of UGC Act, 1956, on the 30th of April, 1987.

The College had a very humble beginning with a few departments in the science faculty, but within a few years, both Arts and Commerce streams were introduced. Post-Graduation in Bengali under West Bengal State University is offered by the college.

From the date of inception of the College (16-08-1968) till date, the number of subjects taught increased from 5 to 21 in General courses and from 0 to 15 in Honours course; the number of students from 143 to about 3,000, the number of teachers from 5 to 85 and the number of non-teaching employees from 7 to 45. Land area under possession increased from 0.197 acres to 3.086 acres, and built-up area from 812 sq.mts to 3,748 sq.mts. This phenomenal growth of the College as evident from the figures above has taken place over three decades, after the College was listed as private college U/S 93 of the Calcutta University Statute (1979) in the year 1994, from its earlier status of a Trust College U/S 100 of the Calcutta University Statute (1979), under the stewardship of Late Dr. C.L. Deb. (Ex-Principal).

In 1997, the Government of West Bengal handed over the stately residential building of Rashtraguru Surendranath Banerjea, doyen of India's struggle for independence and one of the prominent leaders of Indian National Congress, its President. This picturesque possession provided a huge boost to the infrastructure facility of the College.

For all these healthy developments that took place in the past, the College sincerely extends its profound gratitude to UGC and the Government of West Bengal., particularly the Department of Higher Education. The College also sincerely appreciates the role of the local Members of Parliament and Members of the Legislative Assembly over time in helping the College in every manner, financial or otherwise, whenever the College needed it.

We are proud to announce that the second cycle accreditation was done by NAAC in January 2016 and awarded "Grade A" institution.

LOCATION

Mahadevananda Mahavidyalaya is situated on the eastern Bank of the river Hooghly at Monirampore, Barrackpore North 24 Parganas, within the KMDA area and is well connected by bus route, river traffic and railway station (only 2 kms from the campus).

CAMPUS

The campus includes 3 complexes, the Main building, the Annexe building and the RGSN campus, having 3.086 acres of land area under possession and built-up area of 3,748 sq. mts. The RGSN complex includes one pond, a ground and a garden of many varieties of trees and plants which include valuable trees like mahogany and teak and fruit trees like mango, lichi, betel nuts and coconut etc. The College, under the supervision of the Department of Botany, has created an enclosure for medicinal plants.

The RGSN complex has a Memorial Plaque within the campus, at the site of cremation of Rashtraguru Surendranath Banerjea.

Semi open class rooms dotted in the RGSN campus gives it a feeling of an ashram. These were constructed with eco-friendly bamboo structure and mud tiles which were highly appreciated by NAAC peer team during their visit in January 2016. They categorically mentioned in their report that these were like Shantiniketan at Visva Bharati.

RULES AND DIRECTIVES FOR THE STUDENTS

RULES REGARDING ADMISSION

The college is open for admission of students in degree courses. There is a centralised undergraduate (UG) admission process in West Bengal, facilitated by the West Bengal Centralised Admission Portal (WBCAP), streamlines admissions to various state-run and state-aided colleges and universities. Students apply through a single online portal, allowing them to choose from a wide range of courses and institutions. The system aims to ensure transparency, convenience, and fairness in the admission process. Students who passed the Higher Secondary Examination conducted by W.B. Council of H.S. Education or an equivalent examination conducted by any other Board / Council in India or abroad and recognized as such by the West Bengal State University are eligible to apply, subject to the fulfillment of conditions as may be laid down by the college authority and the West Bengal State University from time to time, e.g. a student must have secured pass marks in five recognized subjects of which at least one shall be English in the examination.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION

1. Two sets of self-attested copies of Mark sheet of the previous qualifying examination (original copies to be produced / shown at the time of verification).
2. Two sets of self-attested copies of Admit Card in Madhyamik / Equivalent Examination for age proof. (Original to be produced).
3. Transfer Certificate (Original, where required)
4. Migration Certificate (Original, where required)
5. One Character Certificate / School Leaving Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended (in original).
6. One Self-Attested copy of S.T. / S.C. / OBC / EWS / PH certificate for S.T. / S.C. / OBC / EWS / PH candidates (Original must be produced) (Own certificate).
7. One self-attested address proof. (Aadhaar Card / Ration Card / Passport / Voter ID/ Driving License / Bank Passbook)
8. Four Passport size recent coloured photographs.

NORMS OF ADMISSION OF SC/ ST/ OBC/ EWS/ PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED CANDIDATES

1. There shall be a reserved quota of 22%, 6%, 17% and 3% (= 48%) for S.C., S.T., OBC and PH (Physically Challenged) respectively in each Honours subject and General Streams / Courses.
2. The rules of inter changeability between S.C. and S.T. candidates will be followed, i.e. if adequate number of S.T. candidates are not available, seats will be filled up by S.C. candidates and vice versa.
3. The S.C. / S.T. candidates selected in the general merit list for the unreserved students is to be ignored while complying to the rule of 28% reserved seats for them.
4. Every S.C. / S.T. candidate will apply for admission provided he / she obtained minimum qualifying marks for admission i.e.
 - i) Passed H.S. or equivalent for General Course.
 - ii) Has 40% marks on aggregate or 40% marks in the concerned subject in H.S. or equivalent examinations for Honours Course.

College Tuition Fees

All payments (tuition and other fees) are to be made through online mode.

Notice Board

Important information, directives of all types are notified / displayed on the College Notice Board and college website regularly. Students are advised to go through the notice board / website on regular basis.

Code of Conduct

1. Smoking anywhere in the college premises is strictly prohibited. Chewing of Pan / Pan Masala or Gutka and spitting are strictly prohibited as well.
2. No postering and wall writing shall be allowed in the college premises.
3. Students shall do nothing in contravention of the academic ambience of the college.
4. Students should be decently dressed, maintain cleanliness and practice healthy habits.
5. Students shall not loiter in the corridors or indulge in noisy or disorderly conduct in the class room, office, common room etc. and within the college campus.
6. Students shall be punctual in attending classes.
7. Students shall observe absolute silence in the library and reading room.
8. Any breach of discipline or any disturbance or adoption of unfair means in the examination hall shall be strictly dealt with.
9. Mental or physical harassment of any kind by anyone is a punishable offence.
10. Principal reserves the right to issue TC to a student in the event of his / her breach of moral turpitude.

RULES REGARDING ATTENDANCE OF STUDENTS

A candidate shall not be considered to have pursued a regular course of study in any subject / group of subjects for any examination unless he / she has attended required number of the lectures delivered / practical classes held in the subject / group of subjects. A candidate shall be considered collegiate if he / she has attended 75 percent or above lectures delivered / practical classes held in each of the subjects / group of subjects, and non-collegiate if attendance in any subject / group of subjects falls short of 75 percent but not below 60 percent. A candidate

declared non-collegiate may be allowed to fill in application forms for examination on payment of requisite non-collegiate fees.

A candidate who has not attended at least 60 percent of lectures delivered / practical classes held in any subject / group of subjects shall be considered dis-collegiate and shall be debarred from appearing at any examination.

Attendance for a subject / group of subjects shall be counted from the commencement of the session for theoretical and practical classes.

STUDENT FACILITIES

Learning Management System

Since the onset of the Covid pandemic, and closing down of classroom teaching, both teachers and students have quickly and diligently upgraded themselves to the online teaching learning mode. University Examinations along with national and international level seminars, workshops, external lecturers, academic exchange programmes, etc. were also being smoothly conducted online during this period. In order to facilitate online learning and teaching a learning management system (LMS) has been developed which offers a central location for assignments, communications, course materials, and evaluations, improving the learning environment for both teachers and students. This new direction for the dissemination of knowledge has proved worthwhile for both students and teachers as it appears that this method is likely to stay.

Library

The college possesses a stock of 22, 557 books on different topics and subjects and a number of Journals and Periodicals in its spacious and computerized library. It has got an adjacent reading space. Internet and photocopying facilities are available to all students and teachers. Various departments also have departmental libraries of their own.

Laboratory

The college is provided with well-equipped laboratories with computer facilities which meet the daily needs of practical classes of the students.

Seminars

Seminars, symposia and extension lectures are organized from time to time by the college and

the different departments separately where eminent educationists and professionals are invited as speakers / resource persons. To supplement the curriculum and introduce learner – centric teaching method, students are encouraged to act as speakers as well.

Canteen Facilities

Two canteens are there in our college one at Main Building and the other at RGSN Campus.

Concession, Scholarships, and Grants

College offers students' concession in respect of tuition fees to the needy and meritorious students. Apart from this for S.C. / S.T. / Minority students, grants are awarded by the State Government provided they submit all necessary documents required for the purpose. The State Government also provides financial benefit to the female candidates in the form of Kanyashree. However, the above facilities may be withdrawn on charges of gross misconduct, irregular attendance etc.

Identity card

Each student is provided with an identity card. This card is to be carried always and presented when required. If it is lost, the principal must be informed immediately. A duplicate identity card may be issued on payment of Rs 50 only. In case of transfer from the college this card must be returned to the college authority.

Auditorium - Main building and Annexe building

The college has two very modern and stylish air-conditioned auditorium, one in the Main College Building with a seating capacity of 200 and the other at Annexe Building with a seating capacity of 50. Seminars, lectures, film shows, as well as cultural programmes are held here on a regular basis.

Open Stage

One of the finest of its kind, a huge open stage including two green rooms with modern facility, keeping parity with the colonial structure of the complex, has been constructed in the RGSN campus. This had been a long-standing dream of all the stakeholders of the college, since we had to previously seek space outside the college campus for larger cultural programmes. Set amidst lush green nature, one is reminded of Tagore and his Visva Bharati aspiration.

Uninterrupted Power Supply and Solar Panel

The college for the last several years has arranged for uninterrupted power supply to all the three buildings. For this, three state of the art generators have been installed to ensure comfortable classroom conditions, taking particular care during examinations. College is giving emphasis on Eco friendly and non-conventional source of power. Solar panel has been laid over the terrace of main building and annexe building.

College Magazine

The college publishes a magazine every year with active participation of the students' union. The students, teachers and non-teaching staff help in various ways in bringing out the magazine and also make contribution to it.

Smart Class Rooms

There are two smart class rooms one at Main building and the other at Annexe building with modern ICT enabled facilities. The college is planning to make more smart classrooms for improving the interaction between teachers and students.

Railway Concession

Railway concession forms are issued to bonafide students for travelling to and from the college by train. Railway concessions are also available for educational tours from the college.

Games and Sports

The college possesses a play-ground and a moderately equipped gymnasium complete with various equipment. Accessories and equipment for indoor games (like table tennis, carrom, chess etc.) and outdoor games (like football, cricket, kabaddi, badminton, volleyball, basketball, etc.) are also available. The college organizes annual sports meet, intra-class cricket tournament and friendly football and cricket matches among the different units of the college. The college takes part in various inter college tournaments organized by West Bengal State University and performed remarkably. The students (both girls and boys) of this institution also excelled in All India University Games and Sports in the events like football, chess, and athletics.

Common Room

There are separate common rooms for boys and girls. The girls' common room has a lady attendant and a separate toilet attached to it. The common rooms remain open during college

hours. There are arrangements for indoor games.

Cycle Stand

A cycle shed is available for the students to park their motorcycles and cycles in the RGSN Campus free of cost. (Parking is at one's own risk)

National Service Schemes (NSS)

The college has two NSS units for both boys and girls, under the supervision of designated faculty members.

Students' Union

The students' union is formed statutorily. The students' union not only looks into the academic interest of the students but also manages the co-curricular activities of the college, e.g. cultural competitions, games and sports, observing Bhasha Divas, debate, quiz, blood donation camp etc. It also organizes 'Nabin Baran Utsav' (welcome to new entrants) for first semester students. It also performs Saraswati Puja every year in the college premises.

Lift in Annexe building

The college has arranged for a lift in the Annexe building keeping in mind physically challenged students or staff or other stakeholders of the college. Space crisis makes it difficult to have one in the Main building, but the authorities are trying to think out of the box, to make such arrangements there too.

Drinking Water

All three buildings have water filter arrangements with water coolers to ensure that clean drinking water is readily available for all.

Toilets

Clean and hygienic conditions of numerous toilets for both boys and girls in all three buildings are strictly ensured by the authorities. Running water, jet sprays and sanitizing facilities are constantly available.

Extension activities

The college is trying to develop a formal, regular method of encouraging the students for

participating in different extension activities, sometimes involving Government Organizations and Non-Government Organizations like

1. Awareness programme for Pulse Polio Immunization
2. Thalassemia Carrier Detection Programme
3. AIDS Awareness
4. Blood Donation Camp
5. Health and Hygiene Awareness
6. Medical Camp
7. Stray Animals Safety and First Aid Measures
8. Seminars on different National Issues

Community Orientation

The college observes *Hindi Bhasa Divas* and *Antarjatik Matri Bhasa Divas* with great enthusiasm. *Basanta Utsav* and *Bijaya* celebration are observed each year in the college.

Health Service

The college, under the Universal Membership Scheme of Students' Health Home, has made provision for the treatment of its ailing student at a highly subsidized rate.

Grievance Redressal Cell

The Grievance Redressal Cell, as functioning in the college, is meant for addressing the grievances formally lodged by the students and the guardians. The grievance redressal cell has been formed by the members from among the teaching, non-teaching staff and the students. However, it may be proudly mentioned that any grievance is sorted out before reaching the Cell.

Wall Magazines and Journals

The college provides specific space for displaying wall magazines published by the college and different departments. Students are encouraged to contribute to their departmental wall magazines. The different departments also publish their magazines.

Museum

The college has organized and maintains a museum on Rashtraguru Surendranath Banerjea in the RGSN Campus. The museum remains open for visitors during specified hours. The college is developing the museum by adding a small library on Rashtraguru.

Alumni Association

The college has an Alumni Association. A separate room for Alumni Association has been provided by the college.

Educational Tours

Educational tours are held every year by different departments.

Prizes and Awards

Annual prize distribution ceremony is held at the college every year where the college authority gives award to the students of different streams securing highest marks from the college in the final examination conducted by the university.

Research Facilities

To assist students and staff in their academic pursuits, the college provides a range of research facilities in disciplines such as the humanities, social sciences, and sciences. These facilities can include specialized laboratories, research centers, libraries, and access to online databases and resources.

Eligibility Criteria

A candidate taking up Honours in a subject must have obtained:

- A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

- OR 55% marks in the subject or related subject in the previous qualifying examination
- OR 50% marks in the aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all other clauses are satisfied
- Candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Scheduled tribe category must have obtained 40% marks in the aggregate and 40% marks in the subject/related subjects at the previous qualifying examination (10+2 level) for being eligible for admission in the Honours programme of study. However, if in any Honours subject, the number of applications is so low that even the permitted intake of the college cannot be filled up, then the Principal/Teacher-in-charge may use his/her discretionary power to relax the minimum requirement criteria for admission in that particular subject. A written communication in that regard must reach the Registrar for consideration of that decision for final approval by the Vice Chancellor of the University and the decision will be communicated to the Dept. of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal.

A candidate taking up 3-Year Multidisciplinary Course:

- A student cannot opt for a subject in which he/she failed in the Class 12 examination.

AEC AND SEC COURSES (3 Credits)

Students are required to choose three different SEC courses in their 1st, 2nd and 3rd semester of study from a pool of courses offered by the college.

For AEC, they have to study three courses (each of 3 credits) of English and Modern Indian language (MIL) in their 1st, 2nd and 3rd semesters of study. In semester 1 students will take English or MIL; in semester 2 they will study a course in MIL. Those who cannot study MIL will choose English as MIL; in semester 3 all students are to study a course in English.

For 3 year Multidisciplinary UG programme 2 SECs from one discipline (SEC1 &2) and 2 from another discipline (SEC 3&4) will have to be taken.

Internship:

The student has the option to complete a 4-credit internship in a lab, industrial organization, R & D lab, or through community engagement, NSS, NCC as organized by the college. The student must complete a 4-credit internship by his/her 5th semester of study.
